

Risk of H5N1 avian influenza to Victorian birds and mammals

August 2026

Introduction

Avian influenza H5N1, commonly known as H5 bird flu, is a highly infectious disease that can affect wild birds and some mammals. Understanding which species may be most vulnerable to H5 bird flu is an important part of preparedness and response planning.

This assessment examines the risk H5 bird flu may pose to Victorian wildlife. It draws on scientific research, national risk assessments and expert advice to help guide Victoria's preparedness and response to H5 bird flu, as well as broader biodiversity resilience planning. Species were assessed across high, moderate and low risk categories.

A key input to the Victorian risk assessment was a [national-scale risk assessment](#) prepared by the Commonwealth Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water. Key differences between the Commonwealth and Victorian risk assessments are:

- The Victorian assessment (this assessment) considers the impacts within Victoria, whereas the Commonwealth assessment considers impacts at a national scale. For example, a species with a small population in Victoria that is widely distributed elsewhere may have a higher risk rating within Victoria than at a national scale.
- The Commonwealth assessment uses five risk levels, while Victoria's assessment uses three (high, moderate and low) to better reflect the smaller number of species assessed.

Methods

The assessment considers two things: how likely a species is to be exposed to H5 bird flu (susceptibility) and how severely it could be affected (vulnerability).

- **Susceptibility:** factors that influence the likelihood of infection with H5 bird flu including habitat type (e.g. lives near water), ecology (e.g. scavenger), behaviour (e.g. occurs in large groups), and impacts experienced by similar species overseas.
- **Vulnerability:** factors that may increase the impact of H5 bird flu on a species, including threatened status or existing demographic, genetic or conservation pressures.

Species are grouped as high, moderate or low risk. A low risk rating does not mean a species would be unaffected. It means the risk is lower than for other species assessed.

The assessment considers how wildlife may come into contact with H5 bird flu including contact through water, marine environments and interaction with other animals. Species that are more likely to be exposed, more sensitive to the disease, or already facing conservation pressures are more likely to be rated high or moderate risk.

Results

A total of 559 Victorian native fauna species are considered at risk from H5 bird flu and assigned to the following risk levels:

- **High risk (99 species):** species most likely to be exposed to H5 bird flu and where infection is likely to have serious impacts on populations. This group includes shorebirds, seals and 47 threatened species.
- **Moderate risk (146 species):** species with either a higher chance of exposure or a higher likelihood of population impacts if exposed (e.g. threatened forest-dependent species like Helmeted Honeyeater). This group includes 56 threatened species.
- **Low risk (314 species):** species that are less likely to be exposed to H5 bird flu and generally more likely to recover if exposed. This group includes 42 threatened species
